- 1) What is one of the reasons that we call ancient Mesopotamia "the Cradle of Civilization"?

We call Mesopotamia the Cradle of Civilization because it is where the first civilization, Sumer, was established.

- 2) Mesopotamia is called the land between two rivers. What are the names of those rivers?

The names of the two rivers in Mesopotamia are the Tigris and the Euphrates.

- 3) Why did archaeologists nickname ancient Mesopotamia "the Fertile Crescent"?

Archaeologists nicknamed Mesopotamia the fertile crescent because water from the rivers allowed the early settlers to grow an abundance of crops.
