About 3 Million BCE	Australopithecus Afarensis "Lucy"	3.2 million years old Human-like hominid. Special because she was able to stand upright In addition to bipedalism, difference between australopithecus and apes are the hands	
About 2 Million BCE	Homo habilis "Handy Man"	1.8 – 1.6 million years old First true human Taller, with a larger brain than ancestors Lived in Africa Used stone tools. First toolmaker. Used fire, but could not make or control fire.	
About 1.5 Million BCE	Homo erectus "Upright Man"	1.6 million – 300,000 years old Made and controlled fire First true hunter More advanced tools Migrated out of Africa to Europe and Asia	
About 500,000 BCE	Homo Neanderthalis "Pre Moderns"	About 500, 000 – 30,000 years ago Task-specific tools: Stonetipped spears, bone needles, bone fish hooks Sewed their clothes from animal skins. Animal skin clothes and warm boots allowed them to live in Northern climates Neandertals buried their dead with ceremony, indicating possible religious beliefs	
About 25,000 - 10,000 BCE	Homo sapien "Early Moderns"	40,000 – 10,000 years ago Semi-permanent homes with central hearths for fires Art includes cave art, jewelry, pottery, statues, and tattoos Probably the first loose form of government
